The Community Camp at Shantivan was a multi-faceted event organized for the students as an outreach activity. The camp aimed to enhance students' social responsibility, promote well-being through yoga and aerobics, and foster positive values such as self-discipline, compassion, and community engagement. The camp included a variety of activities, including morning yoga, aerobics, shramdaan (voluntary labor), community visits to institutions, and direct interaction with rural and underprivileged populations and especially the lepracy inmates who are living in shantivan. 

teachers participated enthusiastically in this event.



Overview

- 3. **Eco-Sensitivity Development**: Student teachers have reported a deeper understanding of ecological issues, which they are keen to integrate into their future teaching practices.



how much these children are curious to learn , their dedication towards studying and the importance of education .


































Community work centre: PRAYAS Community work incharge: Dr. Sunayana Kadle Location: Goregaon


