A panel discussion was setup for the students and the panel members were invited in our college. Our respected Panel members consisted of women's from different specializations who have already climbed the top of the mountains in their respected fields yet they were here to share their stories and to inspire us As how difficult was it for them to break the shackles in this women oppressed society and how we might be able to understand the suffering of the women's through their stories.

First our respected Principal Madam and all the teachers invited the panellist, introduced each member and felicitated them as well as thanked them that despite being busy they made time for us. After the felicitation ceremony all the guests took their seats. The respected principal introduced our guests to the foundation of our college as well as the Gandhian philosophy that we follow and also how we are carrying forward the legacy, she also discussed our initiative towards the society by the medium of community work. Dr Francis Vaidya one of our teachers introduced us to the importance and history of why we celebrate women's day as well introduced us to the theme of this women's day that was #EmbraceEquity. Where she continued further with the statement which says —Equity is just not nice to hove, it is must to hove.

The wait was finally over the students were eagerly waiting to have a glimpse of the wisdom that the panel members possess. And so the discussion started with the questions to the panel members. The initiative to ask questions on behalf of the entire college was taken up by Dr. Francis Vaidya -

Where she started with 1st panel member named - Dr Cecelia Chettair - Assistant professor asking her to <u>elaborate difference between Equity and Equality and how in their institution they promotes equity?</u>

- Equity is Raasta, Equality is Manzil. Perhaps a great way to start the discussion. She continued to explain us further by giving us the example of movie "Thappad" where she inferenced the message through the storyline of the movie. Also she introduced the audience to the various welfare schemes for the girls that are been practiced in their institutions to promote the message of equity such as Project Raaha Where they identify physically deficient girls and gave them nutritional breakfast in the college
- Project Sanhari Where they provide ICT training for girls
- Project Raaha Basically A transgender support group.

Also at last she gave us a very important message about mental health and how it plays a major role in tackling the challenges and how important role a teacher plays in the, school and college as counsellor to tackle this challenges. The second guest was Dr. Gauri Gaikwad who can be also be referred to as M/s Versatile, as she is a doctor, an adventurer, a professional dancer.

The question asked to her was - As a women doctor what challenges do women face regards to equity and as a doctor what is her experience and medical facilities provided to women?

- She shared with the story of world's 1st female Dr.Elizabeth Blackwell and how in those days she was criticized for choosing surgery just because she is a women. And she contextualized the same issues that she faced while choosing this career where even after 200 years she is facing the same problems which consisted of unsupportive relatives, biased professors. Even during her clinical practice she faced many different problems in hospital where patients didn't approach her just herause she is a women.

But she fought back and rose from the ashes of criticisms and proved to the world that Yes, I will not tolerate this inequality and I will fight and make a name for myself. She requested that the women's should not be totally dependent on their partner but should be self-dependent and be more votal with their issues. She concluded with the message that Self-oriority is more important than others.

3. "No matter how hard or impossible it is never lose sight of your goal"

Next time when you hear the word "dream" We are pretty sure that the face of Lt. Vinita Hublikar will probably come to your mind.

The question asked to her was -What emotions did you experience when you got title of Lieutenant as a women and plans for the society?

- She was very proud when she was awarded the title as her childhood dream was to be a military officer as this field is mostly dominated by male counterparts. She said that even though it was difficult for her and the road to the title was filled with pebbles, she collected them and built a path to glory. She also urged today's girls to follow the same path to greatness. Her plans for the society was a desire to see more representation of women in N.C.C.

"Tujha asthithva kay" - A simple yet powerful message for women's to create their own identity.

And she concluded with the message of Chase your dreams, No matter what.

4. "There is no greater agony than bearing an untold story inside you."

A dreamer, a believer, an achiever, but most importantly "A Mother". Just think about a mother who doesn't get time to spend with his newborn, her family, just because of her honesty towards her duty. We had our 4" panellist Sandhya Khaire - Police Sub Inspector who is a crime branch officer.

She was asked about - Problems faced by her in this crime branch sector and facilities provided to her?

- She discussed at length about how she faced difficulties during this job at initial stage when she had to visit crime scenes which made her puke sometimes but she never have up and continued to move forward despite the difficulties. She also discussed that when she joined -low salary, no family time and continuous duty were the problems faced by her. She also discussed about the need if family support while choosing the career of your choice. And concluded with the message that - She wants to serve the society till the end as well as motivate girls in education field and uplift them.

5. The last guest Smt.Jayshree Ratan Mam who works for the breast cancer patients through her <u>SAISHA India foundation</u>. They work for awareness of breast cancer and they have made knitted and crocheted cushions that look like a breast which a women who has lost one of her breast can make a use of it. They are made up of cotton and are recyclable.

So, with the last question the panel discussion ended and now students were given chance to ask question to the panel and clear their doubts. The Vote of thanks was delivered by the students of FY B.Ed and SY B.Ed. And the event concluded with the appreciation to all the panel members and with the national anthem.

Report on 3-Day Yoga Workshop at Gandhi Shikshan Bhavan Smt. Surajba College of Education

Introduction:

A 3-day yoga workshop was conducted for the teaching and non-teaching staff of Gandhi Shikshan Bhavan Smt. Surajba College of Education from 20, 21 & 24th April 2023. The workshop aimed to introduce participants to various aspects of yoga, including asanas (postures), pranayama (breathing exercises), mudras (gestures), meditation, and yogic transmission. Visit to Mani Bhavan Gandhi Sangrahalaya

On 19th March, 2022, Gandhi Shikshan Bhavan's Smt Surajba college of education students visited Mani Bhavan Gandhi Sangrahalaya which is situated in South Mumbai. We reached the museum at 9 am and entered the museum when everyone arrived. As we entered on the ground floor we saw that there were many pictures postcards of Mahatma Gandhi and there was information given about each picture. There were pictures of Kasturba Gandhi (the wife of Mahatma Gandhi) ,Shrimad Rajchandra (Gandhi's mentor) and many other significant people who were connected to Gandhi in some way. There is a statue of Gandhi at the center. The library in the Sangrahalaya consists of more than 40,000 books and many periodicals. The books in the collection are more or less about Gandhi, his thoughts, and freedom fighting movements. Some books were even owned or read by Gandhi. There were spinning wheels (charkha) hanging on the wall for display. As we went on the first floor, there were more pictures on the staircase walls as well. On the first floor ,The rooms on either side of the exhibition have been turned into a Picture Gallery which gives glimpses of Gandhiji in Mani Bhavan and important events in his life. It displays photographic posters depicting important events and photostats of some significant letters, articles and documents written by and about Gandhiji with appropriate captions in Hindi and English. A few replicas of Gandhi's belongings and models of his birth place, Sabarmati Ashram, Sevagram Kutir, Phoenix Ashram and his prison cell are also on display.

On the second floor of the building, a room, which was used by Mahatma Gandhi as his living room and working space, has been maintained. Adjoining Gandhi's Room is the exhibition depicting Gandhi's life through mini figures which portrayed every important incident of Mahatma Gandhi in about twenty-eight tableaux, prepared by Smt. Sushila Gokhale-Patel. We learned a lot through this exhibition as many significant movements started from this place. It is a place where in 1921 Mahatma Gandhi did a four-day fast to restore peace in Mumbai. It was very interesting museum which is dedicated to Mahatma Gandhi. We could see the real life things which were used by Gandhi, most of the things which we had only read about. We left by 1 pm after visiting each floor.

MAHARASHTRA NATURE PARK SOCIETY

With the gracious contribution of the Government of Maharashtra, MMRDA, WWF, Dr. Salim Ali and other significant stakeholders, the Maharashtra Nature Park Society symbolizes the transformation of a dumping ground to an abode of the diverse flora and fauna. The park was declared open to the people on 22nd April 1994-"Vasundhara Divas-World Earth Day". The park is now converted into an Environment Education Park and thousands of students as well as visitors visit the park every year for the study of Nature and Environment related issues.

Managing a garbage Dumping site is a global problem now for almost all the countries. MNP being a trend setting solutions for this problem. People from different cities and various countries pay special visit to the park to see the efforts and to experience the effects. The efforts made here are well appreciated by all the people including dignitaries and the scientific community across the world.

The park aims to provide the citizens of Mumbai a quick change to relatively green and unpolluted area and to educate the people, particularly children in Ecology and Nature Conservation.



The park is presently involved in number of activities related to Nature Conservation and Environmental Education. The park has different sections to explain the various aspects of nature education. Some of them are as follows:

Butterfly Garden: Study of butterflies includes knowing their local host plants, the
flowers they visit and pollinate, their survival strategies like camouflaging and mimicry
and whatnot. In the congested city like Mumbai, creation of butterfly garden was also
very instrumental in conservation of (and thereby increase in number of) butterfly at
MNP. It is delight for the eyes to have them in such huge numbers, today the total count
has reached to 85 species. Butterflies are indicator of good quality of air (something

which is always missing in big cities like Mumbai) and therefore creating a Butterfly Park is an education maintaining a better quality of the air.



• Nakshatra Van: Ancient Indians believed in astrology (many still do!). Indian astrology classifies a human being into 27 group as they are considered as born under specific constellation-the Nakshatras. There are 27 constellation's, and each has one plant (tree, shrub or herb) associated with it. Whatever be the merits of their beliefs regarding the heavens, there is no doubt that here on earth its proponents were meticulous documents of nature. More in keeping with the emotional connections that are associated with such myths than any science, different trees and plants finding mention in ancient texts have been planted in a circular garden, called the "Nakshatra van". Many visitors find this to be an inexplicably peaceful part of the park and can be seen quietly meditating under the shade of its now well-developed trees.



• Rain Water Harvesting: During the dry months of winter and summer, the MNP requires an average of 45000 to 1 lakh litre of water daily, most of it for irrigation purposes. This makes the Nature Park depends mostly on the municipal water supply, with some of the demand met from other sources. The Rainwater Harvesting Projects has been conceived and designed to make the MNP almost completely self-reliant for its water requirements. When fully operational it will ensure that nearly 2.5 crore litres of water is collected from the surrounding landscape, including the rooftop of the Education Centre Building. The storage pond will also result in wetland habitat of nearly an acre in extent and help attract additional fauna. This important project also makes a perfect back drop for setting up platform to provide information and as demonstration site, on rain water harvesting.

Thus the institute encompasses a wide variety as well in terms of the exquisite flora and fauna, amphibians, reptiles, spiders, etc.

Report on Socially Useful Productive Work - Workshop

12th May, 2022

Thursday

In today's technosavy world, there are people who are still struggling to get one time meal for themselves. They are not only the underprivileged or marginalized citizens of India but also there are such people around the globe. In such a scenario, due to lack of education and unemployment, people indulge in activities to construct objects from used or left out materials e.g. creating pillows by using cutout pieces of fabrics, mattress-like (commonly known as godhdi in most Indian societies), creative decor items such as wall hangings, photo frames, etc. [which is popularly known as SUPW- Socially Useful Productive Work) which initially become their source of income and later may help them to raise their standards of living and being self-dependent. SUPW is a vocational course which are taught in many Indian schools where students can choose to do courses like painting, craft making, gardening, knitting, cooking, carpentry, glass painting, and many such other craft and hobbies. Nowadays, even the employed people are making this as a side business in order to promote their hobbies.

This SUPW workshop was also organized in our college, to make us learn some skills and become self-reliant. On the morning of 12th May, 2022, after finishing the prayer assembly and yoga, the SUPW workshop was commenced. Firstly, Prof. Sabiha More ma'am introduced us to the SUPW program and its objective followed by the guidance of teacher Gracy Ma'am, who taught us to make wall-hanging. To make this, all the students were asked to bring some unused cotton fabrics and hard cardboards like the rigid covers of used books or cartoons, pair of scissors, etc. She then instructed us on how to start with the wall-hanging by showing the sample and providing 3-4 stencils of different shapes necessary throughout the session. We then made the cutouts by tracing the stencils provided to us followed by pasting the fabrics of contrasting colours. All this was done on the first day of the workshop (i.e. on 12th May,2022). The workshop was continued on 17th May,2022 by first assembling the shapes in proper sequence and decorating the birds with beads, pearls and other customaries and then aligning

the birds on the string with the help of a glue. In doing so, we learnt the quality of sharing. Gracy ma'am is really great. Her instructions were really clear.

Through this workshop, along with learning to make wall hanging, we also learnt many social qualities of which one of the best quality is "sharing". There's a proverb, "Sharing is Caring", and we realised it's so true, every student from the class knowingly or unknowingly was involved into sharing because none of us could manage to complete with this artefact. Nehru Science Centre: Report



Good morning to one and all present over here. I deem it a great honour and privilege to deliver today's report on TTP i.e Teacher's Training Program. This TPP was organized for all science and maths students. It was a five days Training i.e from 12th September onwards to 16th September, which was held in Nehru Science Centre for all the students of science and maths stream. So before commencing with the events and sessions that were arranged. I would like to apprise a short history/information about NSC (Nehru Science Centre), it's establishment as well as it's location. National Council of Science Museums (NCSM), the parent body of NSC, Mumbai, is an autonomous society under the Ministry of Culture; Government of India. NSC is the largest interactive science centre in India. It is located in Worli, Mumbai. The centre is named after India's first Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru. In 1977, the centre started with the 'Light and sight' exhibition, and then in 1979 a science park was built. On 11 November, 1985 the full-fledged science centre came into existence and was finally opened to public by PM Rajiv Gandhi. It has the best infrastructure and skilled manpower to conceptualize, design, develop and organize high quality science exhibits and other related educational programs and activities.

Nehru Science museums and centre provides lifelong engagement by providing access to to real things – objects, phenomena and people; through creating shared, engaging and memorable learning experiences for families and adults. They also provide experiences that benefit teachers and complement school science lessons.11-Jun-2013.

Nehru Science centre stimulates curiosity, develop inquiring minds and expose children and adults to positive new experiences. They help people to cope with the rapidly changing technological environment, and empower them by improving their life skills.

As we are all are aspiring teachers Nehru science centre is indeed a blessing for each one of us it has got everything related to history, geography, science, maths, language, art and craft as well. Science centre consist of surpassing teaching aids that can be beneficial and useful for us,

with the help of such advanced tools and facilities we teachers can make our teaching effective, interesting, distinctive and comprehensive.

12th September, Monday was the first day at Nehru Science Centre. All of us reached sharp at 10:30 at the location. 11:00-11:15 was the time assigned for the registration process. The day was inaugurated with the blessings and guidance of Mr. Kumar Sir, The Director of Nehru Science Centre. We were all pleased by his words and we're ready to participate actively in each and every event as well as activities. First and foremost, all of us were introduced with various tools, types of tools, their evolution and timeline of tool development along with this we were explained about industrial revolution and their occurrence with the help of a PPT. This above session was conducted by the curator, Jain Sir. There after at 2'o clock we were all asked to assemble in activity room where Dharmik Sir gave us a short introduction on teaching aids and how they can be advantageous for us along with this small explanatory session. Sir with the help of some materials taught us different kinds of teaching aids that includes 'Area of circle, Circle and it's diameter and Pythagoras theorem '. The teaching aids taught to us were uncomplicated yet advantageous and productive.



13th September, Tuesday was our second day of teacher's training. Each one of us reported at 11:00 am. There was a small gallery visit arranged for us. i.e. Science for children. All of us visited the gallery we're all accompanied by Shashwat Sir who was the instructor and guide as well for us and he did explain each and every exhibits really well. The gallery consisted of

plethora of energy models, it had lazy sew saw, harmograph, planetary motion, grand shuttle and rising arc. We had a fun time exploring the gallery and learning something interesting and innovative at each and every step. Followed by this visit, we were shown a 3D show. This show depicted the life of all aquatic animals and how they came into existence. Along with this we're shown a science Odyssey show related to space and life of humans in space, their struggles, success and achievements. There after at 2 pm again we had a fun activity session i.e making of teaching aids. The session was directed by Dharmik Sir. He taught us the process of making Electric DC motor and brain model. All of us were highly enthusiastic and took keen interest in the preparation of these models and the session ended well.



On Wednesday 14 September 2022 we reached NSC at 11 o' clock to visit the gallery show

on sound and hearing. It showed doppler effects, delayed sound and all parts of the ear and their function and different sounds created by different animals, sound effects passing from material and air



After that from 12 o' clock we started to visit the machinery world with Nisha ma'am. She told us all compact arrangements of circuits from the previous computer till the latest computer, artificial intelligence sensor, screen bioinformatics recording, remote sensing topological map etc.



From 12:30 onwards we headed to the activity room where lqbal sir had demonstrated REEDORECTEN which is a shortcut of 10 major reactions from that he had demonstrated some amazing reactions we were unaware.

One of the reaction was water + Na2co3+ naphthalene balls + (CH3COOH) vinegar water—co2 release. The naphthalene ball was surrounded by bubbles of CO2 and some movement was seen in naphthalene balls. This reaction showed that the volume increase and density decreases.

From 2 to 4:00 Foldscope

Rajesh sir had given clear instructions about foldscope. This was really amazing as a biology student I loved this activity. Foldscope combines low-cost materials with precision optics to create inexpensive microscopes that are affordable for communities worldwide. With a magnification of 140X, Foldscope can visualize tiny things like bacteria and microorganisms as well as larger samples like insects, plants, fabrics, and tissues. Foldscope can also attach to mobile phones for imaging. This portable microscope is also waterproof. With that versatility, the possibilities are endless!

It was developed by Manu Prakash and designed to cost less than one USD to build. It is a part of the "frugal science" movement which aims to make cheap and easy tools available for scientific use in the developing world.





15th September 2022

From 11am to 12:10pm.

After reaching Nehru science center we entered into a simulator ride machine to provide a realistic imitation of the control and operation of a vehicle. It had a screening ride film called the Great Wall of China. Here we were guided by a crazy old man with a rocket powered chariot. It was a bumpy ride. The time duration was approximately 10minute.



After this we headed to aviation and space enthusiasts, the newly launched Hall of Aviation and Space at Nehru Science Centre is really amazing. Sir explained about the principles of flight and model design. The hall takes its visitors on tour using interactive exhibits, stories, models, artefacts, participatory visualization tools, scale down 3D models of aircraft, helicopter, spacecraft, rockets, and much more.



It also covers early contributions of early pioneers fundamental of flight, air traffic control, history of civil aviation in India, hot air balloons etc.

There is a dedicated corner for Chandran1, Mangalyaan and Astrosat



After space and aviation gallery we started exploring the gallery hall of evolution and our Technological Heritage. Here in this gallery, we came across the origin of different mathematical formulas we use today. Also, we saw different building, architecture, pottery, perfumery, craft, of ancient and medieval India.

From 12:15 to 1pm we went for the show Science on a sphere. In this show Rajesh Sir explained us about atmosphere, geographical features and history of all the planets of our solar systems. This show provides a real time atmospheric and climatic data that is a projected on the 1.8-meter spherical Earth globe. The giant animated sphere appears to be floating in midair and even rotating on it's axis. We have seen ocean and continents in their actual colour just as our planet appears from outer space.it was an excellent visualisation education research tool to learn the earth and space system in three-dimensional format.



From 2-4pm Manju ma'am told the story of Archimedes how he found the solution about given task. That is all about when any object moves or placed in a water especially heavy object it's displace the amount of water that's equivalent to objects weight.

And ma'am showed us that experiment by using standing water and a metal object .and also told us when we took a scale in our figure in such a way and move from one side, it move from other side also due to the friction and force. And many more things told us about physics. After that she told us to make that and we made it in a proper way. Here the 4th day ends.



On 16 September

On the last day of our Teacher's Training Program, we started with Mirror gallery where we saw some amazing properties of different kind of mirrors related to reflection and refraction

phenomena. Then we moved to high voltage current gallery there we saw Lichtenberg Tree, Jacob's Ladder, Arcing Horns and Tesla coil. Also, few of us got the chance of being in Faraday cage under the 1.5 million volts current.

After that Rajesh Sir demonstrated us about the different applications of liquid nitrogen. Rajesh sir demonstrated some experiments which really amazed us. He told us that they have used liquid nitrogen for cryogenics which replaces the welding of metals so in each instrumental part this liquid nitrogen was used by replacing the welding.



The director of NSC UMESH KUMAR sir give their introduction to us and shared some own life story. And remind us today is OZONE DAY give brief information about ozone layer and harmful gasses. After all these both the colleges gave a vote of thanks and certificates distribution session started UMESH sir gave the certificates to each and every students and in this way our 5 days program successfully ended.



We are really thankful for our management our principal Dr. Sunayana Kadle and Professor Vaishali Dhavare who has arranged this wonderful teacher training program.

Time spent in the Nehru Science Center was one of the best learning experiences ever. All the staff members were very supportive, and we got to learn a lot from them. Being a science and maths student, it was the first time some for some. Of us to visit the NSC. We got the opportunity to learn science by performing, as the Director mentioned "learning by doing". The centre is so waste we feel like going again and visiting some of the parts we might have missed. Making teaching aids were very helpful as they taught us how to teach science in much better ways.

Report: Vacha training session

From the 23rd to the 25th of August, 2022, F.Y.B Ed students of Gandhi Skhikshan Bhavan attended a residential training conducted by Vacha- in the Yuva center at Kharghar. During this period, a variety of topics were introduced regarding gender and the structures prevalent within our society.

On the 24th, post lunch we had a session on "Intersectionality and Power walk" conducted by Mr. Pravin Thote. After an ice breaker, the session began with a demo, followed by an activity called the Columbian Hypnosis. It required the participants to work in pairs to lead one another through a space as one participant followed another participant's hand. The partner with the power would move their hands and the other partner's face had to follow keeping 1 feet distance. After one round of this, the power to guide the other was exchanged. In the third round, both partners would guide the other and also follow the other's hand. After this, we discussed our experiences during the activity. It was seen how when one was in power, there was a mix of feelings where they believed they could get the other to do anything. Some had fun guiding their partners however they wanted, others were concerned for their follower's safety. In the second round, when the follower became the one who had the power to guide, again the experiences were mixed. While some wanted to give their partners a taste of their own medicine, the others were more empathetic to the plight of the followers. The third round was the most complicated one to execute and participants through more practice intuitively figured out the balance between dominating and following. Mr. Pravin then went on to elaborate more on the concept of power; the different ways that one can get more power in this society, like education, money, caste, color, language etc. We also discussed the different types of exerting this power, whether it is with a weapon like a stick or a gun, or through monitoring via cameras.

This discussion was followed by our next activity: Power Walk. Participants were made to stand in a straight line facing forwards. They were each given a role. Situations were put forth such as "Can you get a loan worth 10 lakhs?" or "Can you go outside to meet your friends whenever you want?". If the participant's roles could do these things, then

they would take a step forward, If not, then they would take a step backwards. If they were unsure, they would stay in their places. All participants started at the same starting point, but by the end when all questions were asked, everyone's positions had drastically changed. Some were way ahead, some were very far back, and some remained in the middle. When the activity was broken down, it was seen that roles that were given were complex and ranged from "19 year old dalit women who cannot see" to "A 45 year old man with 10 acres of land belonging to an upper caste". Each role given had certain aspects in their description that gave them power such as being educated, belonging to the upper caste or being a man. Each of the roles also had something that reduced their power such as being a dalit, being a women or having a disability. Mr. Pravin further explained how each individual belongs to a multitude of groups (or sections) in society and each of these sections interplay with each other and guide how far we go in life. Through the power walk the participants literally wore the shoes of another person and faced a myriad of situations with all its advantages and discriminations and hence understood the concept of intersectionality.

At 6:30 in the evening, after a short tea break, there was a screening for the movie "Gaon Nahin Kinni Paanch Ka". The story is set in a village setting, where due to government policies, a female needs to hold the position of Sarpanch. Unfortunately the elected sarpanch only holds nominal power here and the real power is held by her elder brother. The elder brother and four other members of the panchayat misuse their powers to benefit themselves at the cost of the village's welfare. When the village faces the consequences of the poor management by the panchayat Kaanta bai, a female dalit representative in the panchayat encourges Sharda, to take her true power as sarpanch in deed and not in name only. Inspired by this, the sarpanch starts working for the prosperity of her village and overcomes various obstacles. The screening was followed by discussion where participants reflected on the movie by bringing back the learnings learned earlier in the day on patriarchy and intersectionality.

The day ended with an assignment on poster making. Four groups would showcase ads on two topics, i) An advertisement for marriage, ii) An advertisement of a product (options were: detergent, car, property and deodorant) The following day- post breakfast- began with a song and a recap of previous days' learnings. The first session of the day was "Gender in Text". The posters made the previous evening were displayed and groups turn by turn explained their thought process for everyone. The session's in-charge, Ms. Steffi gave her feedback for them. After that, participants were divided into new groups and were given texts which had to be analyzed with the lens of gender, patriarchy and intersectionality. Groups came forward turn by turn where they summarized the story and highlighted the issues within the text. The session concluded with Ms. Steffi emphasizing on the power of language- where language is one of the many tools that we use to discriminate between social groups; and that we must be sensitive to the words we use in our daily life.

The last session was taken by Mrs. Nishchint who conducted a quiz on "Women in all walks of life". The quiz covered women in politics, social work, literature, movies etc.

The three day training concluded with a feedback form and distribution of certificates. In those three days every participant had an eye opening experience in a comprehensive list of topics. It changed the perspective and created awareness about many things. Everyone left the training feeling more conscious and critically aware of their own society. It will hopefully impact the way one interacts with members of all social groups, the generalizations one makes about others and help one be a more mindful teacher in the future.


Conclusion:

Followed by that Sabiha mam thanked all and introduced the chief guest that he is Special person not a chief guest he is from national army and he has won gymnastic


award and his sister is gymnast too. His aim is to get medal for 2024 for our country. He spend three hours at gym every day.


Film Screening and reviewing session – 27/01/2022

Visit to Nehru Science Centre- 25/02/2022





Visit to Nehru Science Centre

25th February 2022 Friday

Good Morning one and all. Today is 28th February which is celebrated as National Science Day each year. Science Day is celebrated to honour the contribution of Physicist and Nobel Prize Winner Sir C. V. Raman. On this day in 1928, C.V. Raman discovered a phenomenon of scattering of photons which was later known as 'Raman Effect' after his name. After two years in 1930, he got the Nobel Prize for this remarkable discovery and this was the first Nobel Prize for India in the field of Science. To mark the discovery of his famous phenomenon, National Science Day is celebrated in India on 28th February each year. The theme of National Science day 2022 is 'Integrated Approach in Science and Technology for Sustainable Future'.

Nehru Science centre is the largest interactive science centre in India. In 1985, this centre was opened for the common public and it consists of more that 500 hands-on and interactive science exhibits on different concepts in Science and Mathematics.

Gandhi Shikshan Bhavan's Smt. Surajba College of Education had organised a visit to Nehru Science Centre which is at Worli on 25th February 2022; during the Science Week that is celebrated from 21st to 28th February. This was the first educational visit after the college opened in offline mode, after the Covid pandemic. 20 students from F.Y.B.Ed and 40 students from S.Y.B.Ed had joined for the visit. All the students and the professors met near the entrance of the Science Centre around 10:15 am.

First we went to watch the Odyssey show where we saw the documentary on dolphins in 3D mode. It had a detailed explanation on physical characteristics of dolphins, different species of dolphins etc. It explained how dolphins are one of the most intelligent mammals, their medium of communication through whistling and different types of sounds, their symbolic language, their expression of emotions like sorrow and happiness. It explained the interesting fact of how dolphins record sounds like computers and differentiate between the sounds.

After that we went to the section of Science on Sphere. There we saw each planet in our Solar system along with Moons of some planets on a spherical ball-like suspended object where projections were used on all four sides so the sphere appeared to be moving although it was stationary. Special characteristics like the surface, atmospheric conditions, temperature of each of the eight planets was explained.

Next we took a lunch break of about 35 to 40 mins and all met again excited to learn and see new things after this short break. We next went for a motion simulator ride. We all thoroughly enjoyed the ride in the simulated vehicle. It was a thrilling experience for all. The movie 'Great Wall of China' projected in 3d mode made this ride even more like an adventure.

After that we went to different galleries. The first one is the Hall of evolution. There we saw the history of humankind. There were different sections such as Wheel, a great invention, Braille system, Sensory organ, Plasma sphere invented by Nikola Tesla is a glass globe with lightning bolts streaming from a central electrode towards the outer surface.

In the maths related gallery, Word Numerals and Decimal Place value system where in early centuries of the Christian era a system of expressing numbers by words was evolved. It also includes Area of a Circle, Circle and its Diameter, Big numbers, Pythagoras or Sulba Sutra, Square root and cube root, The technology of India etc.

We also saw Sushruta the plastic surgeon, how in the earlier times plastic surgery was operate. There were replicas of different surgical instruments used in the plastic surgery. There was another section explaining the process of preparing Bhasma.

At the end we saw some experiments on liquid nitrogen which one of the in-charge at the Nehru Science Centre performed. We were mesmerised to see what happens when a balloon is put in liquid nitrogen, the effect of filling a cooker with liquid nitrogen and so on. And last but not the least, some of us saw an extra show at the end, called Kids Show which depicted aquatic life since ancient times and the evolution of different aquatic species.

Many of us had visited Nehru Science Centre before as students but this time visiting it as a future teacher was a different experience. We saw each section from a different perspective, to learn something new and to add it into our lessons to make them interesting. Also, we could see the relation between Science and the other subjects. Later on most of us left the Nehru Science centre full of knowledge and learning and with a small thought at the back of our mind about whatever we had learnt.

Today, life has become easier as compared to what it was earlier and we can say that all this is due to scientific and technological advancement. Improvement in the Medical field, Communication, Bio-technology, Agriculture, Industry, Manufacturing etc has improved the quality of our life. So, our responsibility as a citizen and as a teacher is to understand the role technology has played in our life as well as understanding the need for sustainable development.

And finally, we would like to thank our Principal and our professors for giving us this opportunity to visit Nehru Science Centre.




affected patients and their family members laid the foundation for the workshop.

DAY 1 (27/12/2021)

There were several activities planned on day 2. In the first activity everybody got a replica of objects from the museum where we had no clue what the object could be. The idea of arranging this activity was how can a person think about an object at the first look. We got 10 minutes to interpret everything about the replica which we got. Everyone was excited we wrote all the points on the paper. Whatever we have understood by looking and touching the object. After we discussed every object in the group we explained the points which we noted.

After discussion, we also looked at the proper history of each object which was given for study and also studied some extra objects. It included understanding the history of the object place of exertion. The CSMVS team was really enthusiastic about giving the whole knowledge about each object. The next activity was a reading activity where we provided a sheet where we understood the speed of reading and how it can be utilized in our workshop. After finishing the work the main task was to select items in our exhibition where the challenge was the selection of only 10 items from the group of 25 and deciding the theme of the lesson. It took a lot of brainstorming and discussion to decide the theme of the exhibition and the arrangements of objects according to the theme.

We enjoyed the lunch break where everybody shared the tiffin and breakfast was arranged by the CSMVS team. We all can agree that it's a really challenging job to arrange the exhibition. Afterwards, we visited different galleries of the Vastu Sangrahalaya.

DAY 3 (29/12/2021)

Highlights of the Day 2 workshop was object selection for the exhibition and arranging the object according to the selected theme of the exhibition which is "Million REASONS TO LOVE Indian Subcontinent".

Day III workshop started with a discussion on the importance of museums. After that, we studied the reasons for designing the exhibition and the arrangement of objects according to the requirement by using different pedestals and mounts.

We studied how to make an exhibition and the reasons for planning the exhibition and the target audience for the exhibition so that we can get ideas for planning. In which we also studied that different Target audiences require different designs of the exhibition. After learning how to design the exhibition the exciting part comes, as we learnt how to make the exhibition more lively through activities and making arrangements for different types of challenged people as we study inclusive education.

We also studied how to make interesting lesson plans which include the active participation of students and catering to enthusiasm for the students.

Which included the following activities such as.

- · Storytelling using origami paper
- · Storytelling using drawing
- · Hot seat activity for object interaction.
- Create story with pictures
- · Direct questions and indirect questions.

We also studied theme-based exhibitions like gender equality and language development through the museum. After that, we studied how we can relate the chosen objects with our curriculum and we connected every object to different subjects such as language, maths, science, geology etc.

To understand the object arrangement, we visited the exhibition bus where we studied different designs, use of the bus as per need and arrangements of objects. And best utilization of space and the use of lights to focus and portray the object, highlight the details and show different aspects of the objects.

The motto of our workshop is to understand the importance of museums and planning exhibitions in our school. After learning how to make an exhibition we distributed all students in 3 groups

- Curator team
- Designing team and promoting team
- The educator and activity team

As planning and execution of exhibitions is an important aspect, work is divided into individual groups.




At last, we thanked the CSMVS team for arranging such a great interactive session. We also approached them to visit our exhibition and they agreed without hesitation.



















Give three observation / suggestions to improve the overall teaching – learning experience in your institution.
